Egyptian

• Garden pool: fragment of wall painting from the tomb of Nebamun (no. 9) Thebes, Egypt 18th Dynasty, around 1,350 BC British Museum

Roman

- Garden scene fresco from the Villa of Livia, 100 B.C. 9' high Rome, National Gallery
- Detail of Painting—called an Impressionistic style of painting, like for Roman portraiture—they were concerned with **realism**.

Bellori's notion of the "Idea• comes to life first in the Roman landscape paintings of Annibale Carracci. His are the first "classical landscape" painting in Europe. They combine the observation of nature with the perfection of the intellect.

The phrase "Manifest Destiny" is most often associated with the territorial expansion of the United States from 1812 to 1860. This era, from the end of the War of 1812 to the beginning of the American Civil War, has been called the "Age of Manifest Destiny." During this time, the United States expanded to the Pacific Ocean—"from sea to shining sea"—largely defining the borders of the contiguous United States as they are today.
